One of the most memorable speeches came from 17-year-old Kaitlyn Soules, who gave an account of her courageous battle with cancer. Her entire family was in attendance minus her sister Amanda Uden, currently serving the U.S. Air Force in Minot, N.D. Little did everyone

know, including Kaitlyn, that Make-A-Wish did what they do the best by bringing her sister to the event

With her big sister by her side and the majority of the guests in tears, Uden gave an emotionally charged and heartfelt speech. "There's no way I would have missed this tonight," she told her sister. "I'm so proud of you. Not once during your journey have you ever complained and I'm so happy to be here to tell you that your wish for you, me, Ashley and Christina to go to Hawaii will come true in October."

Next was Bobby Cantwell with a plethora of awards for different categories, such as best stereo, best light show, best dressed crew, and many others. Cantwell then started to talk about an unknown award called the WishMaker Award, an award that Team Formula did not even know existed. While Cantwell thanked everyone who gave rides to Make-A-Wish kids and families, he said that one boat and team took 60 of the 120 participants. It was at that moment he announced that Team Formula was this year's recipient of the WishMaker Award, accepted by Jeremy Porter and Christopher Everett on behalf of Formula Boats.

Per Speedonthewater.com's article, "Other highlights from the auction included the sale of a four-seat golf cart for \$53,000. It was donated back and purchased again for \$33,000. A photo of President Trump brought in \$18,500, the KISS bass guitar fetched \$15,000 and a Generac generator sold for \$11,000 before it was donated back and re-purchased for \$3,000. With the one-off Make-A-Wish challenge coins bringing in \$50,000, it's not hard to see why Cantwell was confident about surpassing last year's numbers. "We've come back stronger every year," he said at the event. "Tonight is the culmination of months of planning, coordination and community."

Participating in a wonderful event with an amazing charity and cause, Team Formula had a blessed and wonderful event, leaving with full hearts and faith that the boating community as a whole comes together to support such great causes at each and every run. Until next time, thank you!
